

Breathe Easier

breathing. Poor ventilation can trap household gases, chemicals and toxins that can be hazardous if inhaled.

This moisture generally gravitates downward into a home's lower levels, potentially causing problems such as mold, mildew, foul odors, structural damage and poor indoor air quality. Excess moisture also nurtures the growth of dust mites.

Fortunately, a product known as Humidex can be installed in places where cool, moist air can stagnate, such as basements and crawl spaces. It replaces the moist air with dry, fresh air. Unlike conventional dehumidifiers, Humidex uses only 38 watts of power and does not require daily maintenance, such as emptying buckets or changing filters.
