


Ask the Experts About Colorectal Cancer

Colorectal cancer—cancer of the colon and rectum—is the second leading cause of cancer deaths in the United States for men and women combined. This year alone over 56,000 people will die from the disease. But colorectal cancer is highly preventable and is easy to treat and often curable when detected early.

National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month, spearheaded by the Cancer Research of America, and its founding partners the National Colorectal Cancer Roundtable and the American Digestive Health Foundation, is held each March to generate widespread awareness about colorectal cancer and to encourage people to learn more about how to reduce their risk of the disease through regular screening and a healthy lifestyle.
