## Easy Garden Color

(NAPSA)—“The colors of my life,” wrote Michael Stewart, “are bountiful and bold.”

In the past, many gardeners who long to festoon their beds with bountiful and bold colors may have looked at weigela—an old-fashioned shrub noted for its spectacular spring burst of pink or

red trumpet-like flowers—but ultimately looked elsewhere. That’s because the shrub had a reputation for having only one season of garden interest. After it finished blooming, it would fade into obscurity.

That’s no longer the case with the introduction of Wine & Roses, the first weigela with dark purple leaves, and the first to win the Pennsylvania Horticulture Society’s Gold Medal. This shrub shines from spring to fall, combining colorful foliage and vivid pink flowers.

In the garden or in the vase, Wine & Roses easily combines with most perennials to create simple yet breathtaking combinations. It has no serious pest problems or cultural requirements, and reaches a height of three to five feet.

Wine & Roses can be used as a hedge, or in a shrub or perennial border to provide season-long color. It’s adored by hummingbirds, which are naturally attracted to funnel shaped flowers, making it a delightful choice for a hummingbird garden.
