The Kentucky Center for African-American Heritage will be home to programs, exhibits and activities celebrating the rich heritage and contributions of African Americans in the state.

Of course, no trip to Louisville would be complete without ruminating upon "the most exciting

two minutes in sports," the incomparable Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs. But, did you also know about the Kentucky Derby Museum, the only museum in the world dedicated to a single horse race?

There is also the world famous Louisville Slugger baseball bat. And, Louisville Stoneware is made right in the heart of the city and boasts some of the most beautiful pottery patterns anywhere. The Belle of Louisville, a National Landmark, is the oldest operating Mississippi-style sternwheeler in the country. And just a few minutes west of Louisville is Caesar's Glory of Rome, the largest gaming vessel in the world.

The 16th largest city in the U.S., Louisville is home to over 90 attractions and 2,500 restaurants. Whether you're planning to visit Louisville for pleasure or attending a meeting or convention, you're sure to find thoroughbred horse racing, bourbon, bluegrass music, sporting events and more.
