

Fertility Help For Families

(NAPSA)—Women and men having difficulty trying to start a family are not alone—and may have more opportunities than they realize.

One in eight U.S. couples of childbearing age is diagnosed with infertility. Some need advanced medical treatment, such as in vitro fertilization (IVF). Unused frozen embryos are stored in fertility clinics across the country. Most individuals who have embryos in storage plan to use them for future family-building efforts, but some who choose not to use the embryos
