Some individuals earn as much as \$80,000 a year and many have benefit packages that include profit sharing, 401(k) plans, life and health insurance and paid vacations.

- **Advancement**—The industry usually provides the opportunity to move through the ranks—from trainee to journeyman to foreman to supervisor to more senior management positions. In addition, roofing workers are often trained in the latest construction technology as the tools and techniques within the field advance.

- **Equal Opportunity**—The roofing industry is among the most ethnically diverse in the construction field. As a result, many roofing crews are bilingual or multi-lin-

gual. In addition, growing numbers of women are being drawn to a roofing career because of its good pay and benefits, as well as the stability the field offers.
