Give Your Home A Makeover

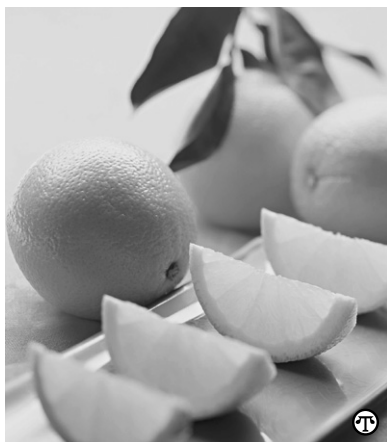
