Adults and children alike can help to support the charities for free simply by sending any of the celebrity-designed stationery to their friends. The charity with the most popular celebrity stationery design at the end of the month of December will receive the gift of a \$25,000 contribution from Yahoo! Mail, while charities with the second and third most used stationery designs will receive gifts of \$20,000 and \$15,000, respectively.

James Gandolfini comments on the charity he chose to benefit from his participation: “I work with the Children Affected by AIDS Foundation for several reasons. First, CAAF is the only foundation that takes care of the day-to-day needs of children both infected with HIV and affected by AIDS due to the loss of a parent or sibling. Second, I am fortunate to have a happy, healthy and vibrant son and because of that, I want to give back by helping children much less fortunate than him and that desperately need our help.”
