



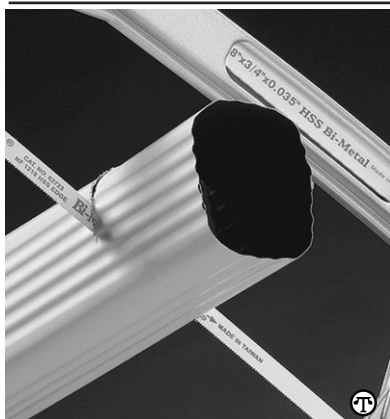

Hacksaw Hints

(NAPSA)—The right tool can help do-it-yourselfers keep simple jobs from turning into big projects. Here's a look at ways to use a new kind of four-in-one hacksaw to make a variety of cuts.



Flush Cuts—A flexible blade can be switched from the 90° configuration to a 45° one to allow for hard-to-reach flush cuts.



General Cuts—The right hacksaw can make quick work of jobs.



Jab Saw—The hacksaw converts to a jab saw that can make inside cuts.



Tight Cuts—The front section of the frame flips up and out of the way of the blade so the saw can be used in tight spaces.

The tool, called the Nicholson® Pro Series 4-in-1 hacksaw, also has magnetic blade storage in its frame for the extra blade used in the jab saw configuration.
