(NAPSA)—Here's an inspiring look at how one young woman's troubles led her to lessen the burden for many others. At age 25, Hope Bevilhymer's right leg was amputated from the knee down, ending a lifetime of difficulty with her bilateral clubfeet. Soon after, Bevilhymer saw a documentary on

African and Laotian refugee landmine amputees who cannot afford prosthetic limbs. It inspired her to create the "Limbs of Hope Foundation," which collects used prosthetic limbs to donate to amputees in countries with histories of hidden land mines.

Bevilhymer's incredible contribution to her community earned her top honors at the Volvo for life Awards, an annual search for and celebration of local heroes. She won a \$50,000 charitable donation and Volvo car every three years for the rest of her life.
