Limelight Hydrangea

(NAPSA)—A new green-flowered hydrangea, developed by the Dutch, could make your neighbors green with envy.

The new Limelight hydrangea is extremely hardy, and blooms every year. Its large, bright green flowers appear in summer and

last until frost when they transform into remarkable shades of green, pink and burgundy.

The effect has been described as breathtaking and many consider this plant to be the highlight of the garden in late summer and fall.

Reaching six to eight feet, the Limelight hydrangea can be used as an informal hedge or as a specimen in the shrub or perennial border. Flower heads, which range from six to 12 inches, are impressive in floral arrangements when fresh or dried—and the green color holds remarkably well even after drying.
