Guide" by David D. Busch (Wiley, \$19.99) is part of a series of field guides to digital technology. This one shows how to get the most out of what has become a popular dSLR camera that's considered

by many to be reasonably priced.

The book demonstrates professional techniques that can make it possible for the reader to take top-quality shots in the field. It explores metering, ISO settings—these are similar to ASA ratings of film—and experimenting with exposures, lens and lighting effects.

The digital field guide is designed to go where photographers go to provide valuable information that can be used in the field.
