



Internet May Give “E-Filers” Many Happy Returns

returns for individuals (1040), corporations (1120, 1120S, 1065) and entities (1041, 990, 706, 709, 550). In addition, the service can prepare returns for electronic filing and can handle multi-state returns.

“The site saves time and money and may take the fear and apprehension out of this annual ritual that so many people dread,” says Redmond.
