These are people who might never have any other chance to see an eye doctor. Many have been known to walk for miles—sometimes for days—for a pair of used glasses. And when they receive glasses, they can see clearly the world around them and the people they love, often for the first time in their lives.

“My five children really got into Sight Night,” said Denise Heniger, a parent from Hooper, Utah. “Last year, the very first house we visited had glasses for us. It was great to have a chance to help my children ‘see’ a way to reach outside themselves. We’ll be back this year.”

Participating in Sight Night is easy. Trick-or-treaters gather a group of friends, family or classmates who want to help. Then, they go to [www.sightnight.org](http://www.sightnight.org) or



call toll-free 1-877-605-4242, to order a free Sight Night collection kit. All eyeglasses collected can be dropped off at any LensCrafters or Lions Club.

And if the Sight Night trick-or-treaters miss your door, you can still donate your glasses all year long at a nearby LensCrafters or Lions Club location.

LensCrafters and Lions Club volunteers provide free eye care to people in North America and on international missions in 25 developing countries. Recycled eyeglasses collected on Sight Night and throughout the year are given to people in countries including Bolivia, Tunisia, Mexico, Laos, Peru and Thailand.
