




Books Worth Reading

Protecting A Family

Fearing for Rachel's safety, Angela is returned to St. Sympatica's orphanage, to receive professional help.

Sixteen years later, Paul and Gina worry the disorder Angela suffers from has finally caught up with her sister. But before they can react, Rachel disappears.

When Paul and Gina discover that Angela has vanished from the orphanage, they are convinced that she has abducted her sister. Will these tragic events serve to pull the family together or will they finally destroy the last familial vestiges upon which they cling?
