


# PLUG INTO ELECTRICAL SAFETY

## Seasonal Safety Message

(NAPSA)—The National Electrical Safety Foundation (NESF) urges consumers to use the following cold-weather safety tips:

- Plug space heaters directly into the outlet—do not use an extension cord—and place them at least three feet away from any

flammable material, such as curtains or draperies, upholstery or loose paper, and out of reach of small children and pets.

- Do not tuck electric blankets into mattresses or under children, don't put comforters or bedspreads on top, and never allow pets to sleep on them when in use.

- Make sure all electrical products and their power cords are in good repair and certified by an independent testing lab such as UL, CSA or ETL. Unplug them when not in use.
