See The Real “Pearl Harbor”

(NAPSA)—Besides being one of the world’s favorite vacation spots, Hawaii has also played a major role in 20th century history.

In 1941, America’s expansion into the Pacific ran headlong into Japan’s expanding Empire of the Sun and Pearl Harbor became the flash-point of the Pacific War.
