## Seeking Heroes

(NAPSA)—When superintendent Harold Overmann encouraged students to find an alternative to fossil fuel, they challenged him to do the same. Overmann led the installation at the Spirit Lake Community School District in Iowa of the first large-scale wind turbine in the Midwest and was instrumental in the installation of a second. The turbines annually save \$135,000 in energy bills and prevent emissions of tons of pollutants.

Overmann is being recognized as an inaugural hero for the Volvo for Life Awards—a national program to seek out and celebrate individuals doing extraordinary things.
