Store your lawn mower in an environmentally-friendly way at season's end

After another season of lawn care, be sure to follow these tips for storing your lawn mower:

1. Run the mower, and inject a gasoline stabilizer to prevent gumming in the carburetor.
2. Empty the oil crankcase and recycle the oil.
3. Remove the engine's air filter at the end of the summer, and prepare a fresh filter for the next mowing season.
4. Don't leave gasoline in the mower or store gas over the winter; always use clean, fresh gasoline at the start of the mowing season.
5. Have your lawn mower tuned-up and its blade sharpened by a trained professional after every 25 hours of use at the end of the mowing season.
