Important tips to help you select the right metal prefab building:

- 1) Only consider manufacturers with 15+ years of experience both making and selling the same product.
- 2) Insist on ICBO and BOCA quality certification to ensure compliance with building code evaluation standards.
- 3) Require that all welds be inspected by Welding Inspectors certified by the American Welding Society.
- 4) Narrow your choices to buildings specifically designed for easy, do-it-yourself assembly so you won’t need to weld, cut metal or use heavy equipment.
- 5) Look for a “clean span” building design without ceiling rafters and support posts so you’ll get 100 percent usable space.
- 6) Make sure the manufacturer has an in-house engineering department and a 24-hour helpline. It’s important to be able to have your technical questions answered in a timely manner.
- 7) Ask about color selections. Coordinating with the color(s) of your home or other structure(s) enhances the appearance and value of your property.
