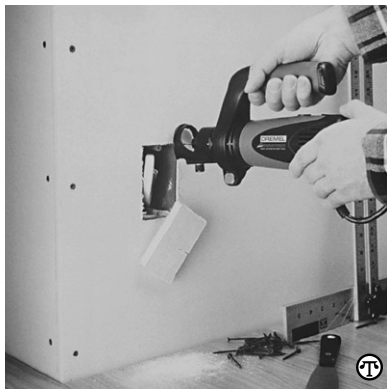


Tackling The Great Indoors

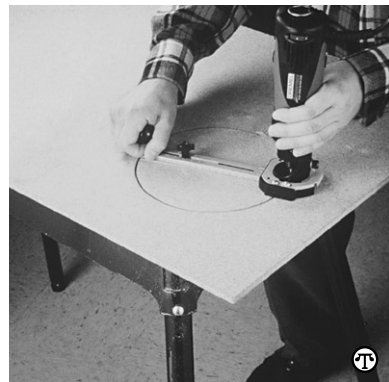
