

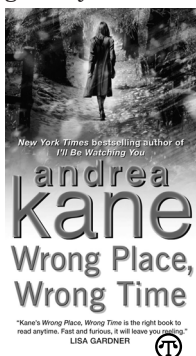


BOOK REVIEW

In the best-selling “Wrong Place, Wrong Time” (Avon), Sally Montgomery’s romantic weekend goes



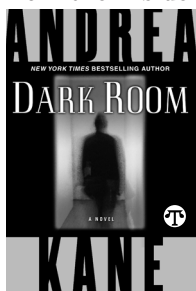
horribly wrong when her companion, Frederick Pierson, is murdered and their cabin burned to the ground.
